Air Incheon selected as preferred buyer of Asiana Airlines cargo business



Air Incheon is set to become South Korea's second-largest cargo airline, being selected as the preferred buyer of Asiana Airlines' cargo business. Reportedly, Air Incheon trumped the other two candidates, Air Premia and Eastar Jet, being a pure cargo carrier and with means to mobilise funds. All three reportedly offered close to KRW500bn (\$360m) for the cargo business. The European Commission provisionally approved Korean Air Lines' (KAL) takeover of its compatriot peer on 13 February, but on condition Asiana offload its cargo arm. In addition, to assuage concerns of a monopoly of long-haul passenger services to South Korea, KAL is transferring the routes between Incheon International and Rome, Barcelona, Frankfurt and Paris to compatriot low-cost carrier T'way Air.

Larger container lines drive operational gains from 'own terminals' in India

As the Red Sea crisis remains a major drag on container supply chains, 'own terminal advantages' are believed to be benefiting the larger container lines serving Indian trades. Mediterranean Shipping Co. (MSC) and CMA CGM have container terminal partnerships with the Adani Group at Mundra Port, India's busiest box gateway. According to industry sources, this strategic investment model has placed these two carriers, particularly MSC, in a uniquely advantageous position relative to smaller lines amid widespread schedule disruptions and unscheduled or ad-hoc calls because of the Red Sea crisis-linked vessel diversions. There are growing trade concerns that MSC vessels have often been given priority or out-of-turn berthing windows at Mundra, forcing other carrier ships offering scheduled/weekly services to wait or even skip calls due to long delays.

Boeing to investigate issues on undelivered 787s

Boeing opens new tab is investigating a new quality problem with its 787 Dreamliner after discovering that hundreds of fasteners have been incorrectly installed on the fuselages of some undelivered jets, two people familiar with the matter said. The latest in a series of manufacturing snags affecting the U.S. planemaker involves incorrect "torquing" or tightening in a Boeing plant of more than 900 fasteners per plane - split equally between both sides of the jet's mid-body, they said. There is no immediate concern about flight safety but Boeing is working to understand what caused the problem and will decide how much if any rework needs to be done once its investigation is complete, the sources said, asking not to be identified.

European container lines introduce Asia surcharges

Two major container shipping lines, Hapag-Lloyd and CMA CGM, have announced new Peak Season Surcharges for shipments originating from Asia. German ocean carrier Hapag-Lloyd revealed an increase in the Peak Season Surcharge (PSS) from the Far East, including Oceania, to North Europe and the Mediterranean. This adjustment applies to all sailings beginning on the tariffing date of 15 June 2024 and remains effective until further notice. The updated PSS amount is US\$1,000 per TEU

At least 65 countries' now affected as Houthi Red Sea attacks continue

Houthi attacks on shipping in the Red Sea have cut box throughput in the region by 90% and, amid escalating insurance costs, it seems it will take more than naval support to lure carriers back to the region any time soon. According to a US Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) report, re-routing vessels around Africa has added some 11,000 nautical miles and \$1m in fuel costs to voyages, but from a financial perspective, this compares favourably with taking Red Sea routes in crisis conditions. The report says: "For many shipping companies, combined costs of crew bonuses, war-risk insurance – roughly 1,000% more than pre-war costs – and Suez transit fees make the additional time and financial costs of travelling around Africa less expensive.

Four new 14,000 teu box ships for Döhle add to bulging global orderbook

German shipowning group Peter Döhle Schiffahrts has broken a long-time holdout to order four 14,000 teu newbuilds in China, adding to a global shipping orderbook that will last past 2029. The company has not placed a newbuild order since 2015, preferring to snap up second-hand tonnage – for example, from Capital Product Partners this year. The new 14,000 teu vessels, each costing \$150m, will be methanol-ready, but will be equipped with scrubbers. This suggests the ships will initially burn heavy fuel oil and be converted to sulphur-free methanol – but it may also imply some capacity for carbon capture could be retrofitted.

Cash for 19 projects to advance Canada's digital supply chain infrastructure

The Canadian government has allocated C\$51.2m (\$37.25m) to support 19 projects aiming to improve the nation's digital supply chain infrastructure. "Strong supply chains help make the cost of living more affordable for Canadians," said transport minister Pablo Rodriguez. "Technological innovation will help make supply chains faster and more resilient. With these investments, we're making sure crucial knowledge and information can be shared and acted on for the benefit of Canadian consumers, workers and businesses." Last year, the federal government launched a drive to advance supply chain digitalisation, inviting proposals for funding.

Integrating AI and Predictive Analysis for Enhanced Road Safety in Sri Lanka In recent years, road safety has emerged as a critical concern worldwide, including in Sri Lanka.

In recent years, road safety has emerged as a critical concern worldwide, including in Sri Lanka. With the increasing number of vehicles on the roads and the growing complexity of traffic patterns the need for effective solutions to prevent accidents has never been more pressing. Fortunately, advancements in artificial intelligence (AI) and predictive analysis offer promising avenues for addressing this issue.

Statistics on Road Safety Incidents in Sri Lanka:

According to the latest available statistics, road traffic accidents remain a significant public health issue in Sri Lanka. In an island as small as ours where almost close to 8 million vehicles are on the road and out of that 50% accounts to two wheelers. Even though the road network around the country is mostly decently maintained, illumination has become a grave concern in the face of the energy crisis faced recently both on normal roads and highways. This coupled with other road, driver, and pedestrian related concerns approximately 7 fatalities daily occur in Sri Lanka.

In 2021, the country recorded over 27,000 road traffic accidents, resulting in more than 2,500 fatalities and thousands of injuries. These incidents not only cause immense human suffering but also impose a significant economic burden on society in terms of healthcare costs, lost productivity, and property damage.

Moreover, vulnerable road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and motorcyclists, are disproportionately affected by road traffic accidents in Sri Lanka. The lack of proper infrastructure, reckless driving behavior, inadequate enforcement of traffic laws, and limited access to emergency medical services are some of the factors contributing to the high incidence of accidents.

The Role of AI in Road Safety

Al technologies such as computer vision, machine learning, and natural language processing have the potential to revolutionize road safety management. One of the most significant applications of Al in this domain is in the development of intelligent transportation systems (ITS). These systems leverage data from various sources, including traffic cameras, sensors, and GPS devices, to monitor and manage traffic flow in real-time.

By analyzing vast amounts of data, AI algorithms can detect patterns and anomalies that humans might overlook. For example, AI-powered traffic management systems can identify congestion hotspots, predict traffic accidents before they occur, and can even optimize traffic signal timings to reduce congestion and enhance safety.

One may think for a developing country such as ours, these solutions are far fledged, impossible to implement and will come at a higher cost. However, at Unilever Sri Lanka (USL), the largest Fast Moving Consumer Goods (FMCG) company whose purpose is to driver vitality and wellbeing of its customers and consumers through its brands in Home care, Beauty & Wellbeing, Nutrition and personal care spaces, road safety is not just as a promise, but as commitment. To enhance the safety during the distribution of our Finished Goods (FG) to a large network of business partners spread across the country, many of the AI based technology has already been implemented which has helped us as a responsible organization reduce accidents related to violation of not adhering to set standards issued to drivers, such as not using mobile phone during travel, not taking adequate rest during long journey, and speeding. Also, Al backed camera system which is set up in the delivery trucks has enabled USL to monitor and track driver ehaviors, which needs correction mostly in the areas of not wearing seat belts, driver fatigueless, distracted driving, and mobile phone usage etc. while they are behind the wheel.

Another tool that is also been used in operation is tracking of vehicles on the move throughout their journey through GPS tracking mechanisms helps Driver Management Center (DMC) established at the DC, monitor and track by driver on basic requirements such as whether the drivers are travelling at the mandated speed limits, whether road diversions have been taken or not. If violations are observed, the information gathered on the same can be used to advice the drivers through helper and return to mandated requirements and standards set out by USL.

These data that's been extracted through the system is monitored by the DMC which is set up at the DC of USL, and used as information to share with the drivers during their counselling sessions which is done on a periodic manner.

Predictive Analysis for Accident Prevention:

Predictive analysis plays a crucial role in preventing road accidents by forecasting potential risks and taking proactive measures to mitigate them. By analyzing historical accident data, weather conditions, road infrastructure, and other relevant factors, predictive models can identify highrisk areas and times when accidents are more likely to occur. For instance, predictive analysis can

help authorities identify stretches of road with a high incidence of accidents and prioritize them for infrastructure improvements such as adding traffic signals, installing speed bumps, or widening lanes. Moreover, predictive models can also inform targeted enforcement efforts, such as deploying traffic police to areas where the likelihood of accidents is elevated. Route risk assessment, issuing


weather alerts to the trucks that leave the DC at Unilever are some of the initiatives which has been implemented at USL, so the drivers are well prepared and are also able to navigate without surprises during their journey and are well prepared to what lies ahead of them giving them adequate time to avoid areas of concerns during their journey.

Our Responsibility towards Road safety

Enhancing road safety requires multi-faceted approach that integrates technology, policy and interventions, community engagement. By harnessing the power of AI and predictive analysis, Sri Lanka can take proactive steps to prevent accidents, save lives, and create safer roads for all users. However, it is essential to ensure that these technologies are implemented ethically and responsibly, considering privacy concerns and potential biases in the data. With concerted efforts from government agencies, civil society organizations, and the private sector, Sri Lanka can pave the way towards a safer and more sustainable transportation system for future generations.

As large corporates that actively drive safety agendas may as well invest on technology and new ways of training and expose them to learning opportunities on how to drive on roads with enhanced safety and mindfully. As done at USL, defensive driving trainings for drivers who drive vehicles on behalf or the company

must be mandated. Also, new ways of learning through Gaming modules will help instill interest in learning how to navigate through challenges posed at drivers during transit. Whilst creating a safety culture lies with the organizations across, responsibility of driving changes and inculcating the same through change, lies with each one of us who are engaged in the logistics and transportation sector which can create a massive change for this country for the days ahead and generations to come.

Firstly, a heartfelt congratulations on winning SOW 2024. As the recipient of the first SOW award in 2023, I'm absolutely honoured to have the opportunity to feature you in this publication. Our readers would love to get to know you.

1. Please tell us about your background and journey in the field of logistics, transport, and supply chain and as he legal advisor at the Commercial Port, at Seychelles please tell us about your role at work?

As the legal advisor of the Seychelles Ports Authority I advise the organisation on a daily basis on everything from operations, employment, safety and security etc. the legal unit plays a role in ensuring the port remains compliant with international and national norms and regulations.

2. Being actively engaged in port operations, what are the challenges women face and what steps has your establishment taken to address them?

Sevchelles Currently, the Ports Authority has under its employ 85 women and 203 men. Most of the women are in administrative positions or falls under the security department. In maritime operations there are only men (i.e. coxswain, tug masters etc.). The organisation is very open to diversity and inclusivity in the sector, however the problem of trying to have more women in these post is a national issue rather than just the organisation. This is due to a lack of knowledge attracting young girls to be enticed to study and work in the maritime operations sector.

The organisation together with other organisations and WiLAT Seychelles in the sector have previously organised talks with for example the maritime school, radio shows etc. to help 'spread' out the word.

 What initiatives have you taken to empower women in the Port and how has this positively contributed to their personal and professional development.

We participated in the WiLAT IOI Diversity and Inclusion project by some of the below exciting initiatives as we witness a great level of response.

- · Participated in local radio shows.
- Women's day dissemination of information;
- Participated in talks with the maritime school;
- Initiated discussions with a local training institute to target the participation of women in logistics to training;

- Participation in the electric mobility project in the Seychelles being carried out by the Department of Land Transport.
- Give us a brief to your journey with WiLAT and what inspired you to join this professional body.

I joined WiLAT in 2021 as I was working at the Ministry of Transport, through the ex-chairperson of WiLAT Seychelles I learned of the existence of the organisation and what it entails. I am constantly in awe of the strength of women in sectors that they have always been discouraged to be part of or joined as it being something carried out by men. I therefore wish to do my part as a young woman and contribute to the empowerment of women as much as I could. Be it in the logistics and transport sector and all other areas. In 2022, I became the chairperson of WiLAT Seychelles when Ms. Moube stepped down.

What initiatives are you taking at WiLAT in your home country to create awareness and impact to help the growth of WiLAT.

There is a lot of work that is being carried in Seychelles. I'm happy to share some key highlights;

- Participated in National Radio shows to create awareness around WiLAT
- Women's day dissemination of information;
- Participated in talks with the maritime school;
- Initiated discussions with a local training institute to target the participation of women in logistics to training;
- Maritime week 2024 which will happen in Seychelles, WiLAT Seychelles is organisation a whole day of exercises (tree planting, team building) and is inviting women in different organisations in the sector to participate.
- As the Winner of Stars of WiLAT 2023 what is your message to the young leaders of the industry.

It is never easy to want to achieve something and even starting or trying is difficult. You will meet many difficulties in your life and sometimes you will feel discouraged and want to give up. My advice would be to always strive as much as possible, and it is important to take the time to do so. Taking one day off to re-centre yourself is not going to slow down your progress as tomorrow you will be more prepared.

Be humble about your achievements and always be open to help others wherever possible. What you give can come back to you tenfold. 7. Global WiLAT is championing on some significant programs such as the D&I Program, Autism Program, Green practises and sustainability initiatives. What program/s are you planning to roll out in your home country and play a vital role in ensuring the program objectives are met.

Personally I think that work life balance is very important for the mental wellbeing of a person. Especially a woman, juggling work, being a wife, being a mother etc. In work we wear the shoes of the professional and outside of work there are many aspects of life that affects us mentally. Many women go through different events in their lives taxing their mental and emotional health but are still expected to come back to work the next day and perform to the highest professional standard.

I wish to be able to help women have access to tools which will help in their mental wellbeing. For example, We have initiated contact with OUR BABY ANGEL FOUNDATION of Seychelles, whom tackles the issue or miscarriages, child loss and infertility. Members of WiLAT have been made aware of the existence of the foundation and if so wish can join the organisation. In the future we wish to carry out activities with the foundation.

8. There is a strong appetite for change in making way for women in logistics, transport and supply chain by implementing promising practises. We understand for this to take place we need strong support at senior levels including legal reforms. Being a legal advisor at the Port please share your concluding thoughts.

I think legal frameworks exists and are continuously evolving. In my experience the main issue remains in the education and enforcement of these legislations. For example sexual harassment in the work place etc.

Women need to know that they have a right to not be sexually harassed even to the simple act of 'cat calling', and the employers need to ensure that women have a safe space to come forward for such cases and that they follow through on proper enforcement.

It has been an absolute pleasure interviewing you. I leave our readers with the thought believe in your abilities and don't be afraid to assert yourself. Your unique perspectives and skills are invaluable. Seek mentorship support fellow women and remember that your voice matters in every room you enter. Let's lead change!

Interactive Webinar on Full of Dynamism






